Each outdoor session will bring to life the pages of the <i>Boy Scout Handbook</i> to help you deliver the promise of Scouting to yourself and the youth you serve. It will increase your comfort level and give you confidence as a trained, skilled leader. The program will also give you the opportunity to work with other Scout leaders from your area, meet new friends, and reinforce skill techniques with fellow unit leaders. Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters and Varsity Leaders are considered trained when they have completed What is Scouting (or Fast Start), Leader Specific (for SM/ASM's or Varsity), Youth Protection Training, and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills.
